On behalf of ADI, we urge the Sioux Falls City Council to support innovation and local small businesses by voting to lift restrictions on drone use, specifically, the changes to the Sioux Falls City Ordinance "AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY BY REVISING CHAPTER 95: PARKS AND RECREATION, SECTION 95.012 FIREARMS, GUNS, FIREWORKS, AND CERTAIN REMOTE CONTROL AIRCRAFT PROHIBITED" We thank you for your leadership on this issue. Furthermore, we were pleased to see that the vote at the first reading was 8-0, and encourage the full City Council to approve these much-needed changes.

Motivated by constituent concerns, this opportunity to foster the drone economy was brought to the attention of the City Council, spearheading the effort to create a glidepath that will advance drone technology in Sioux Falls. Commercial use of drones has the potential to transform and provide cost-savings to businesses at the heart of South Dakota's economy. With the repeal of these prohibitive policies, the Council will help citizens grow their agricultural and other businesses in new and exciting ways, take photographs of South Dakota's landscape from the most unique perspectives, create art and survey fields.
